

Supplementary Aids and Services

According to IDEA, **Supplementary Aids and Services** means, aids, services and other supports that are provided in regular education classes or other education-related settings to enable children with disabilities to be educated with non-disabled children to the maximum extent appropriate.

Supplementary Aids and Services can include changes in:

- **Environment**
 - Special seating
 - Study carrel
 - Providing space for movement or breaks
 - Providing help to maintain an uncluttered space

- **Instructional Strategies**
 - Teaching to a child's learning style
 - Providing one-to-one instruction
 - Providing differentiated instruction
 - Providing hands-on activities
 - Using technology to support instruction

- **Social or Behavioral Support**
 - Rest breaks
 - Teaching child how to make friends
 - Functional behavioral analysis
 - Positive behavioral intervention plan
 - Teaching independence

- **Staff Support**
 - Enhanced staffing
 - Co-taught classroom
 - Small group instruction
 - Providing staff training
 - Collaboration time
 - Use of paraprofessional staff

- **Assessment**
 - Allowing answers to be dictated
 - Allowing additional time
 - Reading test to student
 - Accepting short answers
 - Highlighting key directions
